HIGHLIGHTS:

- Scheduling for floor slab pours was a challenge as the contractor was in high demand on other jobs, however; concrete floors are completed with with insulation vapor barrier and wire mesh under slab. PLFN Project Manager has arranged for concrete testing by EnGlobe Geotechnical Services and the preliminary report is good. Hardness report after several days is being complete.
- Under floor plumbing and conduit is complete, tested and approved.



Steel studs, spray foam insulation and pressed steel frames are being completed.

The electricians are on site installing wiring throughout.

Above ceiling rough-in of mechanical and electrical continues throughout the entire building. The major air handling units are installed in the mechanical room on the north end of the building. Additional major mechanical and electrical equipment is arriving on site daily.

Drywall is complete at the underside of wood framed roof areas.



The mass site cut (excavation and soils movement) is completed. Much of the soils were placed behind the houses on Beach Road to extend the backyards of the residents. Twenty tandem loads of soil have been distributed to community residents who requested it. Type2 gravels are in place at the parking lot and service areas. A compaction test was arranged by the PLFN Project Manager indicating some further compaction is necessary before the next level of gravel is laid.



Exterior windows have been installed – These are Solera energy efficient windows. They are designed to deliver superior visual, acoustic, and thermal comfort. They allow for light diffusion, visible light transmittance, and solar heat gain and better acoustic performance. They have a much better with a higher thermal insulation around R18. Ideal for new construction and renovations, Solera® is UV-stable and includes a warranty against color shift for greater peace-of-mind.



SCHEDULE:

Substantial completion is scheduled for October 31, 2019

OTHER:

NS Power has placed a pole marker on the site near the service area. The service area which will contain the propane tank and vaporizer, compost shed, garbage dumpsters, generator pad, and transformer. The service area is defined with type 2 gravels in place and will be completed with additional gravels compacted to allow 30-ton trucks to access.

The propane tank and vaporizer will be provided by MacGillivray Fuels and will be leased by PLFN.

Fibre Op distances have been established so that the contractor can order materials for installation.

NS Dept. of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal, RCMP and the Project Manager recently staked out the new school zone and signage necessary to slow traffic around the school during school hours. Signage will be placed in October before the school opens.

The design is being finalized for the Wigwam structure to be built in the centre of the bus loop for the school and community use. It will be a very large structure and will have electrical supply and WIFI. The structural components have been sent out to fabrication specialists for pricing.

Time Capsule: The education community and larger community need to determine the contents of this time capsule.

The construction of the natural play areas was delayed until the major cut of soils were complete and final grades are determined. The contractor for this work will be on site during the final week of September.

The school/community composting shed is awarded to Higgins Construction from Trenton and is being coordinated by the CMM Waste Management Department. It will be constructed in the service area.

We are awaiting word from funding sources regarding financial assistance for the installation of the generator. If full funding is not available, we are planning to install a concrete pad and transfer switch and connection to the electrical panel for future use.

Waste Management containers have been ordered with assistance from CMM and will be in place when the school opens.

The architect has produced a sketch showing the sod and hydroseed areas around the school. Dora is presently getting prices for this work.
