CALL FOR PROPOSALS

PLFN Language Training Program Curriculum Developer

Pictou Landing First Nation is calling for proposals for a Curriculum Developer to develop a Mi'kmaq language curriculum for an upcoming community-based Mi'kmaq Language Teacher training program. The curriculum will be linguistic-based of phonology, morphology, semantics, syntax and grammar. The program will have a language component, creation of student learning resources and activities, and a cultural component.

The successful person will be a Mi'kmaq speaker who is familiar in reading and writing Mi'kmaq in the Smith-Francis orthography. They will be knowledgeable in successful language acquisition strategies such as TPR (Total Physical Response), ASLA (Accelerated Second Language Acquisition), etc.

Experience teaching a language is required.

The proposal should show curriculum development work you have been involved with or developed yourself. The proposal should also include a budget and a timeline.

This is a contract position. There will be travel expected (from home community to Pictou Landing) to meet with the Language team. Community engagement will be required.

Proposals will be accepted until Friday, June 28, 2019
