

Terms and Conditions

The following terms and conditions are translated directly from the Dutch version. Therefore, the Dutch version is leading in the interpretation of the terms and conditions.

Article 1: Definitions

The following concepts are meant by these definitions:

1. Event:
Neuroanatomy Championships
2. Organizer:
The committee, appointed by Jeroen Dudink (employee at the UMC Utrecht, department Neonatology, Wilhelmina Children's Hospital), consisting of: Eline de Groot, Eline Kruithof, Ida van de Water, Jeroen Dudink, Lauryna Filatovaite and Marlijne Boumeester. The committee receives additional help from Freek Hoebeek, Paul Govaert, Hans ten Donkelaar, Tom Ruigrok en Martijn van den Heuvel.
3. Participant:
A natural person, not acting as an entrepreneur, who applied for participation in the Event in a by the Organizer approved manner.
4. Agreement:
The agreement between a Participant and the Organizer, ongoing up until and during participation from Participants to an Event

These terms and conditions are applicable to every agreement.

Article 2: Participation

1. Participation to the event is only possible for bachelor, master, PhD students or employees of a university or a university of applied sciences, which are situated in the Netherlands.
2. The Participant can only participate in the Event if he completed the registration form and genuinely filled it in, if the registration fee is completed and if the Participant agreed with the Terms and conditions.
3. Participation in the Event is done by the Participant in person. It is not allowed to let someone else participate in the Event, instead of the Participant himself.
4. Individuals who belong to the Organizer, or who are involved in formulating, making of or asking questions, are not allowed to participate in the Event.
5. If the Participant is unable to participate in the Event, the registration fee won't be refunded. Registration fee is not refunded.

6. In case of exceptional circumstances, the Organizer can decide to not let the Event take place. Based on exceptional circumstances, the Organizer can decide on premature termination, suspension or neutralization of the Event. As well, on the basis of circumstances the Organizer can decide to modify the course of the Event. In these cases, no refund of the registration fee takes place.
7. A decision from the Organizer not to let the Event take place can not result in liability for compensation of costs made by the Participant.
8. A Participant can only participate in the Event if he signed up using the registration form associated with the Event, which has been genuinely filled in and signed, or which has genuinely been filled in and signed electronically at the website of the Organizer, and if the registration fee has been completed. Registration for an edition of the Event won't be possible anymore after the Organizer has closed the registration association with this edition.
9. After registration, the Participant is obligated to pay the registration fee. If a Participant is unable to participate in the Event, the registration fee won't be refunded, neither partially. Other payments on the basis of the agreement won't be refunded either.
10. By participating in the Event, the Participant agrees unconditionally with the rules and the competition rules.
11. During or after the Event, no written communication or communication by phone will take place concerning the Event. Every attempt to fraud will irrevocably lead to immediate exclusion of the Participant **and/or the beneficiary of the fraud, unabated the other remedies/appeals of the Organizer.**

Article 3: Liability

1. Participation is at own risk. The Organizer can not be held responsible for any kind of damage, that a Participant can suffer from as a consequence of participating in the Event, unless the damage is the direct consequence of intent or coarse blame imputable to the Organizer.
2. If, despite the first statement of this article, the Organizer is accountable for damage to the Participant, compensation by the Organizer for that damage is limited to maximally the amount that the insurer of the Organizer pays.
3. A Participant needs to be insured sufficiently for the risk of damage that he, or an heir, may suffer as a consequence of his passing, damage or illness, caused by participating in the Event.
4. The participant indemnifies the Organizer for damage that third parties may suffer from as a consequence of actions attributable to the Participant regarding the Event. The Participant needs to be insured sufficiently against the risk of liability for intended damage.

5. Sponsors of the Event and the municipality in which the Event is held are excluded from liability.
6. The Participant does everything in his power to prevent damage or physical damage at third parties.
7. The Organizer can not be held accountable for technical issues that may occur during the Event.
8. The Organizer is not accountable for any kind of damage to belongings and/or people, as a consequence of participation in the Event or use of the price.
9. The Organizer decides for all cases not stated in the rules. The Organizer retains the right to terminate, extend and/or modify the Event at a desired moment according to their own insights.

Article 4: Portrait right

1. The Participant gives permission to the Organizer to publish pictures and other imagery made during the Event, in which the Participant and/or participating company are visible.

Article 5: Personal details

1. The personal details provided by the Participant are stored in a database by the Organizer. By accepting the agreement, the Participant gives the Organizer permission to use the personal details for sending information to the Participant and for providing personal details to third parties for the purpose of sending information to the Participant.
2. The Participant is allowed to object, written or via email, to the sending of information by the Organizer or to the providence of personal details, after which the Organizer will quit this sending and providing. By accepting the agreement, the Participants grants the Organizer permission to disclose his name and tournament results, for example by means of publication in newspapers and via internet.

Article 6: Personal belongings

1. Since we are guests at the concerning location, all the Participants and volunteers should behave as a guest and show respect for each others belongings.
2. If the Organizer keeps belongings of the Participant during the Event, or if the Participant - either with or without permission of the Organizer - leaves belongings behind in a room either controlled by the Organizer or not, the Organizer can not be held responsible for damage that occurs as a consequence of loss, robbery etc.

Article 7: Duration of the Event

1. The Event takes place at 22-11-2019.

The price will be communicated to the winner 22-11-2019 at the latest, during the Event.

Article 8: The winner

1. The Participant who answers most questions in the right way, including bonus questions, is the winner. If an ex aequo is determined, the Participant who answers the last decisive question first and right, will win.

Article 9: The price

1. The winner receives a trophy as price.

The price can not be replaced by money or an arbitrary other form of compensation. The Organizer can, if he is forced by circumstances against his will, replace the price by any other similar and equivalent price.

Article 10: Competition rules

1. The competition rules of the Neuroanatomy Championships are applicable for the Participant and/or Participating company participating in the Event. The competition rules are part of the terms and conditions. The valid competition rules can be found in the appendix of these terms and conditions.

Article 11: Legislation

1. The terms and conditions are subject to the Dutch law, and are interpreted and executed according to the Dutch law. Any kind of dispute resulting from this or associated with the Event, that can not be solved amicably, will be presented to a for that competent judge (the court of the central Netherlands). A dispute is deemed to be present, if one of both parties declares that this is the case.

Competition rules

The competition rules below are applicable to the Dutch Neuroanatomy Championships (henceforth named the Event).

Rule 1: Participation

1. Participants participate in the Event individually. Every form of help from outside during the Event will result in disqualification.
2. Participation in the Event can occur if the following conditions are met:

- The Participant is a bachelor, master or PhD student of a university or university of applied sciences in the Netherlands.
- The Participant has paid the obligatory financial contribution of 10 euros via “Tikkie” before 15th of November.

Rule 2: Terminology

1. During the Event, terminology from “Terminologica Anatomica” will be used:
"Terminologica Anatomica", the book of international anatomical terminology by the Federative Committee on Anatomical Terminology (FCAT). See also: <http://fipat.library.dal.ca/> for a free download.
2. The handled terminology will preferably always be in Latin, both in the questions as in the answers during the Event.

Rule 3: Presence and registration

1. All the Participants should be present before [time] at november 22, 2019 in the Wilhelmina Children’s Hospital (Lundlaan 6, 3584 EA Utrecht).
2. All the Participants should be registered before [time] at november 22, 2019 in the Wilhelmina Children’s Hospital, at the spots allocated for it.

Rule 4: Course of the competition

1. During the Event, the instructing of the competition leader will be followed accurately and completely.
2. During the Event, instructions will continuously be given for the upcoming round, after which answer forms will be handed out and the round will be played.
3. At the end of every round, the answer forms will be picked up, after which the correct answers will be announced.
4. There will be four rounds in total.

Rule 5: Answering of questions

1. During every round, ten questions will be asked. Participants fill in the answers to the questions at the answer form assigned for it. Questions should be answered in English, with the exception of the brain related terminology, which should be answered in Latin, as stated in rule 2 of this article. Questions answered in another language than English will not be judged.
2. During the rounds, when questions will be asked and answered, the Participants are not allowed to talk.

Rule 6: Calculation of points

1. Points will be allocated based on the answers given at the answer forms assigned for it.
2. At the answer form is indicated how many points can be achieved per question.
3. In total, 110 points can be achieved per round and 440 points can be achieved in total (of which 40 points for bonus questions).
4. The achieved points will be announced after the entire competition, during the award ceremony.
